# The Lord Works in Collaborative Ways

e have all heard the phrase "the Lord works in mysterious ways." We say it when strange things happen, coincidences occur, or when fortuitous events take place. Somewhere in the back of our mind we might think of that famous verse from James, "Every perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of lights..." (James 1:17). We credit God when good things happen to us. We don't always understand them and we don't always expect them. But we all know that the Lord works in mysterious ways.

But the Lord also works in collaborative ways. In fact, I suspect that the Lord works in collaborative ways far more than in mysterious ways. Jesus called his disciples and sent them out to continue his mission of reconciliation in the world. Jesus invites the church to work alongside him as he draws all people to himself. That is one of the best things about being a part of the church. We have the opportunity to work with Jesus carrying on God's mission of love, grace, care, and compassion in the world.

This work blossoms from a sense of gratitude. It is indeed true that every gift we have has come from God. Our loving creator has given so much to us. In response to those blessings we are invited to become a blessing. That is the heart of stewardship. We do not just give money to keep the church open, pay the salaries of the staff, or meet budgetary goals. Stewardship, at its core, is an act of praise and worship. We are offering our first fruits back to God in thanksgiving and gratitude to God. We are also partnering with God in the work of ministry. We are collaborating with God. The Lord works in collaborative ways. This year we are making that phrase our stewardship theme.

I hope you will consider that phrase as you consider your pledge this year. How are you partnering with both God and all the members of this parish to do the work God is inviting us to do? I have always said, when you pledge you are actively supporting every ministry

of this church. We are collaborating together in order to spread the good news of God in Christ.

When we join our resources together we can make a difference. When it comes to



stewardship here at St. Michael's you may have noticed that we don't really focus on the budget, or what our financial needs are, or even how much we hope people will give. Those things are important to be sure. But what is more important is that all of

us participate. Our main goal for stewardship this year is 100% participation. We hope to see every single person who attends St. Michael's complete a pledge card. How much you give is not our primary concern. We are not asking for equal gifts. We are asking for full collaboration and participation. Join with us as we join God in the work of ministry.

ou may remember that last year we named our children's ministry as our primary growth area for 2015. We wanted to welcome a Children's Pastor to our team. We wanted our kids to know that they are full members of our parish. Their formation and faith is so important to us. We were thrilled to welcome Amber Russo as our Children's Pastor and we are so excited to see the work she is doing. This year we want to continue to make ministry to our children our primary growth area. That means continuing the work of having the Children's Pastor position fully funded in our budget.

In 2016 we want to focus not only on our young children, but also on our teenagers. We have a growing youth group. Each year more kids move up from the fifth grade into the sixth grade. Stefanie is doing a great job leading our youth, but we know we can continue to grow in this area as well. We believe it is time to begin searching for a part-time Youth Pastor as well. This person would partner with Stefanie and co-lead our youth

t has been such a great honor and such a great pleasure to take over as the Director of Music. I first would like to thank Kristen Toedtman who did such a great job as the Director of Music for quite a few



years. Kristen is a great musician, a great music leader, and a great person. She certainly will be a difficult act to follow!

From about the time I was in the fifth grade I knew that I wanted to have a career in music. My training is in voice and music education. In college I was a double major and I have a BM degree in Vocal Performance and a Bachelor of Music Education degree. After I graduated from college I taught Kindergarten—eighth grade music and choir, first in Minneapolis and then in New York City in the borough of The Bronx. I went to graduate school at the College-Conservatory of Music at the University of Cincinnati and earned both my MM and DME degrees. In 1990 I moved to Los Angeles and started my college teaching career as a Professor of Music at Cal State LA.

# Family Sing




