Jesus Asks Peter, "Do You Love Me?"

t the end of the Gospel of John there is a famous conversation between Jesus and Peter. Three times Jesus asks Peter "Do you love me?" Peter assures Jesus that he does indeed love him. After each assurance of Peter's love Jesus tells Peter to "Feed my lambs." This passage is filled to the brim with meaning and possible applications. One option is to interpret the passage quite literally—those that love Jesus are to feed others. We are called to carry on the mission of Jesus who puts a very high priority on caring for those in need.

We here at St. Michael and All Angels have decided to take this call from Jesus to heart. We are dedicating our fall activities to doing what Jesus asks—feeding people. We began the month with the annual CROP Walk. This event happens all over the country and is truly a wonderful event. Churches of every variety, flavor, and size join together, raise money, and walk to help fight world hunger. St. Michael's Outreach makes one large donation on behalf of the congregation. Participants are then also encouraged to find sponsors and raise additional money from outside the parish. Nancy Woods and Julie Bellevue Smollar will be happy to share with you how the event turned out this year. You may even want to start planning now for next year!

On the first Sunday of every month our parish also participates in Sack Lunch Sundays. This is a food packing event which supplies food to hungry people. We make close to two hundred bagged lunches during coffee hour. These are then picked up and distributed by MEND (Meeting Each Need With Dignity—www. mendpoverty.org).

The great thing about our Sunday Sack Lunch program is that anyone can participate. Young and old alike can make sandwiches and fill paper bags with apples, chips, water, and love. It is a great hands-on ministry that makes a real and immediate difference in the world. Avi Aazami can give you all the information you need about participating in Sack Lunch Sunday.

These are two events in which we are taking the words of Jesus—Feed my lambs—literally.



But Jesus said it to Peter three times. And so we have one more opportunity before the end of the year. On December 12th, St. Michael's will once again host our Holiday Cheer event. This Christmas party welcomes hundreds from area shelters

for a huge holiday blow out event. Each child receives gifts from Santa. There are crafts and activities to participate in, sports to be played, and even family portraits to be taken. don't worry if you are busy on December 12th. There are plenty of volunteer opportunities and needs to prepare for the event. You can shop for kids providing them with gifts and outfits to open on that day. You can come to the church on December 11th and help decorate the Ministry Center and help with set-up for the party. You can even sign up to come after the event ends and help us clean up. Christmas Cards for Prisoners

Pring a note of holiday cheer to a prisoner in solitary confinement at coffee hour on Sunday, December 6th, by signing a Christmas card along with a brief message. Cards, postage, first names, and message points will be provided, along with a letter from our Rector. The return address will be St. Michael's.

There are currently several thousand inmates in solitary confinement in California. Hundreds have been there for decades, locked in windowless cells 23 out of 24 hours a day—a practice defined as torture by the UN. An historic settlement earlier this year, to a lawsuit brought by prisoners, is designed to put an end to this cruel and barbaric practice. Cases are slowly being reviewed and inmates released into the general prison population where they will at long last be eligible for job training, classes and, most important, contact visits with their loved ones, touching, hugging, and finally being able to sit and talk without a glass partition separating them.

Cards, especially at Christmas, can bring hope and comfort to those so often forgotten. I am looking forward to seeing you on December 6th.
