## Making Plans...

t is that time of year again. Summer has come to an end, school is back in session, and a new program year is beginning here at St. Michael and All Angels. That means we have been making plans for all we hope to do, accomplish, create, and offer. Allow me to share a little about what we are planning...

September sees the return of the St. Michael's Parish Choir and Bell Choir. We are blessed to have had our section leaders serving as cantors and soloists most Sundays of the summer. As wonderful as they each are, it is always a joy to welcome back the full choir. This talented group leads our worship each and every week. In addition to their weekly anthems and musical offerings, they also sing for our special services. I am grateful to each member of the choir, David, our Director of Music, and Duane, our organist, for their commitment. We will also welcome back the St. Michael's Bell Choir in September. This is another group of committed and talented individuals who complement and round out our music program.

Our 9:15 am Bible Study will continue this fall. Our group has chosen to study the Gospel of John this fall. A reading schedule will be provided on the first day of our discussion. This Bible Study is conversational and relaxed. Please join us as we begin this new study.

Our youth ministry, under the fearless leadership of the Rev. Stefanie Wilson Brown, will begin again this September. The youth group, consisting of teens 6th through 12th grade, gather for conversation and faith formation on the first Sunday of every month. Each month also includes a youth group activity. Some months these events are fun, social activities, while other months they are service activities. See this edition of the newsletter for more information about the youth ministry.

The observance of the Feast of St. Michael and All Angels will take place on September 25th with a festival Choral Eucharist at the 10:30 am service. This year we will host a potluck lunch in the Ministry Center immediately following

the service. It will be a glorious service with fun activities for the whole family available that day. More information on this will be available as the date gets closer.



October traditionally kicks off our annual stewardship campaign. All members of St. Michael's are encouraged to prayerfully consider their contribution of time, talent, and treasure by completing an estimate of giving (pledge) card. These

pledge cards allow us to prepare the 2017 budget.

The first weekend of the month, October 2nd, is the ever popular Pet Blessing service. We remember and honor the Feast of St. Francis on this day. Your dogs, cats, and/or pets of any kind are welcome to attend church with you at the 10:30 am service. The service will conclude with a general blessing of all the animals. Individual blessings will be available in the courtyard immediately following the service. Coffee Hour will be available both in the Ministry Center and on the patio. Those with pets in tow are welcome to enjoy the outdoor Coffee Hour. Those who prefer to keep their distance from four-legged friends are welcome to enjoy the Coffee Hour inside the Ministry Center.

November kicks off with our annual observance of All Saints' Day on November 6th. This is the day we remember our ongoing connection with all those saints who have come before us and who are now with God. The book of Hebrews calls this the "Great cloud of witnesses." The necrology will be read within the context of the Eucharistic Prayer that day.

November 6th is also the day of what has become one of our more popular outreach events. CROP Walk will be held on the 6th following the service. The St. Michael's team will once again be organized, money will be raised to fight world hunger, and we will walk together to raise awareness. More information on CROP Walk is available in this edition of the newsletter.

The North Hollywood Interfaith Food Pantry will host the annual Interfaith Thanksgiving Service on Wednesday, November 23rd. Our Sunday School students will collect food over the course of the month and that collection will be given at the Interfaith service. Keep an eye out for flyers announcing the time and location of this years' service.

**December** is a busy time around St. Michael's. We begin the month with Advent Lessons and Carols, which will be on December 4th at 5:00 pm. This service is a wonderful way to begin the Advent season.

Holiday Cheer, our largest outreach activity of the year, will take place on Saturday, December 10th. We will once again welcome kids from MEND and other area shelters, throwing them a Christmas party they won't soon forget. Set-up and decorating will happen the evening before on Friday, December 9th. We also traditionally schedule our Christmas caroling outing around this time.

Blue Christmas returns on Wednesday,
December 14th at 7:00 pm. This special service
is designed for those who find the holidays
difficult, depressing, sad, or painful. Blue
Christmas is a quiet, contemplative service lit
by candles. The music is different from what
is regularly heard on Sunday mornings. All are
welcome to attend, even those who are not
feeling blue.

Christmas is always a special time here at St. Michael's and this year will be no different. Christmas Eve will begin with our Christmas Pageant at 5:00 pm, the Holy Eucharist immediately follows. We look forward to the return of our Christmas party, which takes place after the early service in the Ministry Center. Our second service of the night begins with music at 9:30 pm, followed by the Holy

## An Update on the Search for a New Bishop

he Diocese of Los Angeles will elect a Bishop Coadjutor at our December, 2016 Diocesan Convention. This new bishop will become our Diocesan Bishop immediately following the retirement of the Rt. Rev. J. Jon Bruno, currently planned for some time in late 2018. Over the past summer the Bishop Search Committee has been conducting interviews and narrowing down the field of nominees with the goal of releasing a slate of candidates this September. Reports from the committee indicated that approximately twenty members of the clergy were initially nominated for the position. This included local clergy from within the diocese, and some from outside the diocese. Reports from the search committee also notified us that nominees included international candidates, as well as some candidates who are already bishops in other dioceses of the National Church.

Recent updates from the search committee (at the time of this writing) indicate that the field has been narrowed down to seven names. It is our understanding that further interviews will produce a smaller slate of finalists. However, the exact number of how many finalists will be on the slate is still unknown at this time.

In October, the finalists will all be available for what is known as "walk abouts." This will

be our chance to meet the candidates in person, ask questions, and form our opinions. The diocese will also make biographical information and resumes for each finalist available for review.

On December 2, 2016, the Diocesan Convention will gather at the Ontario Convention Center. All ordained clergy—deacons and priests—of the diocese are eligible to vote. Each parish and mission of the diocese also sends representatives, known as delegates, to participate in Convention. St. Michael and All Angels gets three delegates. Our elected delegates are Anne Kelly, David Connors, and Julie Bellevue. If you are interested in the Diocesan Convention you are always welcome to attend as an observer. Observers are not eligible to vote, but you can be there in person to see who gets elected!

This is an important time for our diocese. I urge you to keep the election of our next bishop in your prayers.

"Almighty God, giver of every good gift: Look graciously on your Church, and so guide the minds of those who shall choose a bishop for this Diocese, that we may receive a faithful pastor, who will care for your people and equip us for our ministries; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen."

## On the Topic of Bishops...

t. Michael's has a new area bishop. With a diocese as large as Los Angeles the bishops divide it into regions and assign an area bishop to



provide pastoral care and oversight to the individual parishes and missions in those regions. The Rt. Rev. Diane Jardine Bruce has recently been appointed as area bishop for Deanery 1 and 2 (St. Michael's is located in Deanery 2). These areas include the San Fernando Valley and the region north of us including Thousand Oaks, Camarillo, Oxnard, Ventura, Santa Barbara and a bit beyond. Bishop Bruce also serves as area bishop for parishes in Orange County. Previously the Rt. Rev. Mary Glasspool served as our area bishop. Last year Bishop Glasspool accepted a new call to serve as the Assistant Bishop of the Diocese of New York. She began her new ministry in that diocese in April 2016. We are excited to have Bishop Bruce as our area bishop.


