# Being A Blessing By the Reverend Dan Justin

Dese anyone else feel like the holiday season should begin with the crack of a starter's pistol? We're off! It is November and the race has begun. Looking back over past November and December newsletter articles, I noticed a theme. I discovered that I frequently write about finding ways to intentionally slow down during this season of the year.

My articles include prose about watching and waiting for the coming of Jesus. I regularly recommend making space for quiet, solitude, and peace. Who was I kidding with all that? Please allow me to make a confession: I have never been able to follow my own advice. I can't slow down at this time of year. November and December is a CRAZY time at church. We are finishing up the stewardship campaign and getting ready for Advent Lessons and Carols. Holiday Cheer is coming up, an event which is awesome, but also takes a lot of work (mostly done by Meredith and her amazing team of volunteers).

As if things were not busy enough, Diocesan Convention is inconveniently scheduled for early December. The budget must be finalized, preparation for the Annual Meeting begins, and new members of the vestry are being recruited. There is Blue Christmas to plan, regular Christmas to pull off, and two Christmas Eve services to enjoy. There are parties to attend and presents to buy. Then, just about the time I think I have everything under control, I remember that my mother's birthday is on December 20th. How do I forget that almost every year? How can I slow down? And if I can't slow down, why would I think you can slow down?

Perhaps it is time for a new strategy. What if we admit to ourselves that we are not going to be able to slow down at this time of year? What if we let ourselves off the hook and let go of any guilty feelings we have about being so frazzled? Slowing down can become one more thing to do, and we already have too much to do. What if we ask a different question instead? Some time ago, I was reading an article written by a pastor of a different tradition. While I don't remember where I found the article or even what the article was about, I do recall one thing the author said. He reported beginning each and every day with the same prayer. Each day, as he left his home, he prayed, "Lord, help me



to be a blessing to someone I encounter today." I love that prayer.

hat if we adopt this prayer for this busy season? "Lord, help me to be a blessing to someone I encounter today."

This could be the perfect Advent and Christmas plan. We know we are not going to be able to slow down. There is too much to do and too many people to see. Instead of feeling guilty about it, let's plan for it. Let's approach each and every day seeking opportunities to be a blessing to someone we encounter. Let's ask God to help us see those opportunities when they present themselves.

You could even keep a list or a journal. At the end of the day, before you go to bed, reflect on your day. Write down who you met and what you did to be a blessing to someone. After you have written it down, take time to thank God for the opportunity to be a blessing. And then, ask God to continue to bless that person. Pray for that person, even if they were a total stranger. At the end of this busy season, when you find a free moment to reflect, you may just discover that somewhere along the way, you encountered Jesus. Oh wait, isn't that what this season is all about in the first place?

# **Noisy Church**

Have you noticed that church has been getting noisier? It is a wonderful blessing and a joyful sound. St. Michaels has been experiencing growth. We now have approximately seventeen babies in our parish. From newborns to toddlers, there are little ones everywhere.

What are we going to do with so many kids? Some are too young to attend Sunday school. Our current nursery has a maximum capacity of six (we maintain a 3 to 1 ratio of nursery workers to children). Well, the quick answer is that we are not exactly sure yet. We are working on it though. We are exploring options. We may need to set-up a second nursery in one of our other Sunday school rooms. There is the possibility of exploring curriculum for younger children. Any potential plans will require two things: some money, but far more importantly, some volunteers. If you are interested in working with Amber, our Children's Pastor, on some of these or other ideas, please feel free to talk with her. She will be thrilled to explore opportunities for ministry with you.

In the meantime, parents are always welcome to have their children in church with them. We have coloring books, puzzles, and some toys available in the back of the church. Kids are most welcome here! What if they make noise during church? No problem! It's their church too. Sometimes church just needs to be noisy. We can all make a joyful noise to the Lord, together.

# Vestry Nominating Committee

The Vestry Nominating Committee has begun receiving names of members interested in election to the Vestry. The vestry is the elected, lay leadership of the parish. Each newly elected Vestry member serves for a period of three years. The Vestry meets on the third Tuesday of each month.

### Diocesan Convention: Bishop Bruno Retires; Bishop Taylor becomes Bishop Diocesan

On Friday, December 1, 2017, at the start of the annual Diocesan Convention, Bishop J. Jon Bruno will officially pass the crozier (the Bishop's staff) to the Rt. Rev. John Taylor. With this symbolic gesture, Bishop Bruno begins his retirement, and Bishop Taylor becomes our new Bishop Diocesan.

John Taylor was elected Bishop Coadjutor at the 2016 Diocesan Convention. He was ordained and consecrated as a bishop in July of 2017. A Bishop Coadjutor is elected to succeed a retiring Diocesan Bishop. The Rt. Rev. John Taylor will be the seventh Bishop of Los Angeles.

# The History of Holiday Cheer

# 20 Years of Bringing Christmas Cheer to those in Need

**S**t. Michaels hosted the Holiday Cheer party for the first time in 2004, but the party to bring cheer to needy families and deliver Santa gifts to children started back in 1997. That means this year we are celebrating Holiday Cheer's 20th Birthday.

In the Spring of 1997, Jane Wilson and a group of friends volunteered at a makeover day at Good Shepherd, a shelter for homeless women and children. They had learned about the party through Big Sunday, an organization dedicated to connecting charity causes in LA. Good Shepherd twice a year hosted makeover parties for their clients at the shelter. About a dozen hairdressers and stylists would donate their services. Jane thought she could add to the event by inviting comedians to volunteer and entertain the children while their moms had their makeovers. When she learned Good Shepherd needed extra help with providing Christmas gifts for the children, Holiday Cheer was born. Here was a day to celebrate families, honor hard-working mothers, and provide

gifts for children, who may not otherwise have a Merry Christmas. Volunteers would be able to give back and interact with the families who needed good cheer the most. The next year Good Shepherd accepted Santa gifts and new outfits. Jane and a bunch of friends from the LA community gave a Holiday party through 2003.

ane Wilson and her family started attending J St. Michaels in 2004. She pitched the Holiday Cheer party to the parish who signed up and wanted to include MEND, a center to help poverty-level families of the San Fernando Valley. St. Michaels had learned in October that the MEND facility had been damaged in a fire. The room that housed the clothing donations, as well as toys for Christmas that year was destroyed. Jane and the church leadership took it upon themselves to pay back at the Holiday Cheer party and make it the biggest Outreach event of year. St. Michaels opened its doors to the women and children of Good Shepherd, and clients from MEND. A contact at My Friend's Place also heard about the good work of St. Michaels and invited a group of teenagers and new parents to attend the party. A Downtown LA drop-in shelter also invited their clients. The first Holiday Cheer party at St. Michaels quickly grew to full capacity and 70 extra children arrived. Every volunteer that day worked to ensure that every person had a lunch to eat and every child received a toy and a new outfit. It was chaotic to be sure,

# Advent Lessons and Carols: An Old Tradition in a New Form

Advent Lessons and Carols is one of my favorite services of the year. Traditionally, the service is held at 5:00pm on either the first or second Sunday of Advent. Lessons from the scriptures are read and the choir sings anthems or leads hymns in response to the lessons. It is a beautiful way to enter into this season of watching and waiting.

Unfortunately, this amazing service is not always well attended, most likely because it is on a Sunday evening. The choir puts a tremendous amount of work into the service. While they are not performing for the benefit of the congregation, it can still be discouraging to have only thirty or forty people present, especially when twelve of them are in the choir. How do you offer the Advent Lessons and Carols service in a way more people can participate? You move it to Sunday morning!

This year St. Michael and All Angels will once again enter the Advent season with Lessons and Carols. However, instead of 5:00pm, the service will take place during our normal Sunday morning worship times. Both our 8:00am and 10:30am services will feature an abbreviated Lessons and Carols service (abbreviated in that it will have six lessons rather than the traditional nine and there will be no sermon that morning). The Holy Eucharist will still be celebrated at both services.

We hope many more people will be able to participate in our annual Advent Lessons and Carols service this year. It will be on Sunday, December 3rd at 8:00am and 10:30am (please note, the 8:00am service will not be led by the choir).

The Blue Christmas service will take place on Wednesday, December 20, 2017 at 7:00pm in the church.




